HISTORY OF THE SOUTH CAERNARVONSHIRE YACHT CLUB 1924 to 2024

It is now 100 years since the South Caernarfonshire Yacht Club was established in Abersoch. The Caernarfon and Denbigh Herald reported on Friday 31st August 1923 that a well-attended meeting was held at Abersoch to discuss the question of forming a Yacht Club for the district from Nefyn to Porthmadog. It was resolved that the name of the club for the first twelve months should be “South Carnarvonshire Yacht Club”.

The annual subscription would be one guinea, with two guineas entrance fee. Members under 16 years of age to be admitted for 10s 6d. The Captain of the South Caernarvonshire Yacht Club recorded in his Log that on the 9th June 1924 racing was opened “by a race for the five boats (four of them new) of the Seabird Class”.

This was the start of the activities of the SCYC, and it is the Hundredth Anniversary of this start that we celebrate in 2024. To be correct, the first decision to form a yacht club at Abersoch would appear to have been taken in 1922 as in 1929 the Captain stated “The Club may now look backwards 7 years since its inauguration”. However, the first Commodore, Mr. F.C. Minoprio, was appointed in 1924 and this is considered to be the true start of the Club.

The Clubhouse itself was not built until 1925, being opened by Mrs F.C. Minoprio, who announced that the Club membership totalled 200. The event was celebrated by a Seabird Race. We can assume from this, that the first races were controlled from an exposed position on the headland like the Abersoch Village Regatta which had been in existence since 1881. The records for 1925 also show the first recorded protest when “two boats in the Junior Seabirds Class were disqualified because the paid hands had handled the sheets”. It was also recorded that Lady Members would be admitted to the club.

Racing at this early stage was held only for the Seabird Half Rater Class, but as larger boats arrived, a handicap class was formed of all the boats. In 1926 the Seabirds were up to twelve boats and they held their first Ladies Race. The Captain reported in this year; "The Sailing Committee thought that as 11 races were sailed in 1925 this made life almost too strenuous and, in arranging this season's programme, had cut down the number of races somewhat. It would also appear that it was in 1926 that the first accident occurred when "Catalina" sunk "Janetta" on moorings when returning late from New Quay in a blow".

By 1928 the large boats had become a handicap class in their own right, and the Club had two classes racing. Perhaps the most famous of all Abersoch boats was "Runag", a large green gaff-rigged yacht which was almost unbeatable to windward. She is first mentioned as winning in 1930 again in 1933 when she won the first Causeway Buoy race. From this time until the early fifties she ruled the larger boats at Abersoch and was only beaten on rare occasions. However, she never seemed to be as fast once she had been converted to a Bermudan rig.

In 1935 the Club took delivery of ten "one-design" dinghies designed and built by C. Colquhoun of Dunoon. That the Club was not used to dinghies is proved by the honours board which to this day has them down as "Dingies". These open 14-foot clinker boats, with red cotton sails, were reported in the "Yachting World" magazine as one of the fastest dinghies of the day and, at an initial cost of £29, were of good value. Research into their markings has shown that the centreboards were manufactured from steel salvaged from the German High Seas Fleet that was scuttled at Scapa Flow in 1918. By present day standards they were slow, sailing at the end to a PYS of 129 but, as speed is relative, they provided excellent racing, and a third class for the Club. With none of the present-day dinghies around they provided excellent training craft, and many present-day members learnt their sailing skills in these boats.

The years between 1939 and 1945 were the war years and all activities at the Club ceased. However, the Clubhouse was not quite deserted as army

patrols kept a lookout from the balcony. The Club was in other good hands also. There is a story that a present-day member, once well known in Squibs but then a child, approached a soldier, asked him what he was doing and, if he was not a member, would he please go away.

After the war, sailing gradually got under way again. The old boats were re-commissioned and in 1946 fifteen races and one Regatta were sailed. However, as new designs appeared, and more and more people discovered the delights of Abersoch, the tempo rapidly increased.

In 1952 the Captain reported that the gaff rigged yacht had disappeared from Class A, and that the first race to Aberdaron had been won by the 30 sq.metre "Austral" (Frank Whipp). It was probably during the early fifties that the largest changes in sailing and boats took place. We saw the rise and fall of Class 1 which included the West Solent Restricted class, Six Metres and Thirty Square Metres, the arrival of the Dragons (although "Greylag" had been around for a long time), and the advent of the faster dinghies such as the Cadet, Firefly and GP14 which put paid to the club dinghies. We saw the last of the "nobbies" and an end to the reefer blazer and white yachting flannels for the AGM and Prize giving.

In 1960 the first offshore race for the James C. Eadie Cup should have been held with seven entries, two from Ireland and the West Solent "Benita" owned by the Eadie family. It was cancelled due to gales but was won the following year for the first time by "Vanya II". The idea of forming an offshore fleet at Abersoch was started at this time by five keen members who included Tom Smith (in whose memory we now have the Tom Buoy). To begin with they found a certain amount of opposition from those who considered that Abersoch was too far removed from the offshore scene, but events have since shown that their efforts were well worthwhile with the Club being in the forefront of offshore racing in the Irish Sea and winning the prestigious "Victoria Cup" on two occasions. The races up until the early 1960's were sailed around some of the old buoys in the bay which were used to guide supply vessels into the harbour. As the Club expanded and the number of boats and Classes increased over the years, the old buoys with

their “landmark” names were replaced with new marks which follow the points of the compass. The pre-1960 Blue Books have charts of the racing marks in the bay and the details of the Courses plus the Sailing Instructions and the Racing Programme. The Sailing Instructions are now issued separately from the Blue Book

During the 1950's the Club expanded at a rapid pace. The Honorary Secretary could not hope to manage an ever-increasing membership so a full time Secretary was appointed. The Cove was acquired, demolished and rebuilt in 1974, it was officially opened later that year by Mrs Alice Hancox. The large exposed girders on the sun deck are designed to take the weight of a third storey should there ever be a need to expand the Club further. Incidentally, a hermetically sealed time capsule containing artefacts of the Club's Golden Jubilee is buried inside the Cove building.

In the early days the only way for crews to get out to their boats on the moorings was by dinghy. As the membership increased there was not enough storage space for the dinghies and a launch service was introduced. At that time the jetty finished at the concrete steps with “walkies” taking place at every low water. A group of members who lived in Abersoch organised a fund-raising campaign which resulted in the existing wooden jetty being built.

Class 1 (Classic Boats) rose and declined and today is no longer used. Class 2 became the Offshore Class, with a steady expansion, including both Cruising and Racing categories. Class 3, originally the Dragon Class, rose to an average of twenty-six boats racing but declined and became the Sports Boat Class for a few years until the Dragons returned reclaiming Class 3. The number of Seabirds in Class 4 has decreased over the last few years. 1999 was the year that the Seabirds celebrated their Centenary, and they were one of the main Classes in 1924. Class 5 were the emergent class of the seventies with Squibs and Pandoras leading the way. The Squibs now form Class 9 and Pandoras remain strong in Class 5. Class 6 now has a wide variety of Fast Mixed Dinghies and Class 7 includes the Slow Mixed Dinghies, depending on their PYS Ratings. Topper dinghies are also included in Class 7 but they

were in Class 8 with the Mirrors for a few years. Mirror Dinghies are now in Class 7 so Class 8 is no more and neither is Class 10 for the Optimist Dinghies. Class 6 & 7 now have their own open week in July although it would appear that their owners spend as much time crewing on the keelboats. The old Class 8 also has its own sailing week over the summer. There is now a separate Class M for Motorboats which has grown rapidly over the past few years, but the newest and most interesting Class is Class 12 for the Radio-Controlled Lasers. These lovely little Model Yachts are sailed every Sunday morning in the winter by a dedicated group of enthusiasts with their Class Captain Paul Proctor.

Club racing has risen to over three hundred starts which is a fantastic increase over 1924. I wonder what the Sailing Committee of those days would have thought of having to organise them? Over the years the Club has hosted many National, European and World Championships for both dinghies and keelboat classes. The most prestigious is probably the Edinburgh Cup for the Dragon Class. This will be hosted by the Club this year and was first hosted by the Club in 1962 and then again in 1976, 1982, 2012 and 2019.

In 1951 the Club hosted the National Firefly Championships. The Abersoch Dinghy Week, originally organised by Aubrey and Beryl Allso, has gone from strength to strength and now attracts hundreds of entries from all over the country. Their crews often preferring to come to Abersoch rather than going to their own National Championships. If the dinghies could have a successful week of their own, could this be the same for the keelboats? The answer was ‘yes’, and the Abersoch Keelboat Week is now a firm fixture on many sailing programmes. In fact, with modern business constraints on time, there does seem to be a trend towards a full week of racing for many of the classes.

In the 1990's many people felt that the opening of the marina at Pwllheli would have a detrimental effect to the Club. This would not appear to have been the case. Certainly, the larger yachts spend most of their time moored in the marina but many have also kept their moorings off Abersoch. The

marina seems to have attracted more yachts to Tremadoc Bay and when the weather is fine the anchorage off the clubhouse is reminiscent of Regatta days. The facilities in the Club have been updated on many occasions and the Bar and Clubhouse have recently undergone a thorough refurbishment. The Cove provides refreshments and also caters for weddings, and functions connected to the Sailing Events, combined with one of the most stunning views in the country.

The exposed position of the Club on the headland means that the building needs constant maintenance. Over the past few years there has been storm damage to the Clubhouse, the Cove and the Jetty. A dedicated band of Members, Staff and local builders have worked together to meet the high standards demanded by the various Championships and Health and Safety requirements. The Club also offers RYA Certified Training Courses for VHF Radio Operators, First Aid and Race Officer Courses and has done for some years.

The rapid development of electronic devices has meant that the recording of Race Results has changed over the years. The Club uses the Sailwave system for racing results which can cope with all the various handicap systems in the Sailing Classes. Club V1 allows the members access to the Race Results online. VHF Radios, Mobile phones, GPS instruments, iPads and computers are now commonplace. The cannons were replaced with an electronic sound and light system some 50 years ago, and the green screen pc is still starting and finishing races today.

The Covid Pandemic in 2020 meant that after Lockdown in March, all Club activities were suspended and the Welsh Rules were applied. This is the only point in the Club's history, where the Club honours boards have a missing year other than WWII. It was with great relief that sailing and other Club activities resumed in 2021.

From the 1950's onwards, the Club has produced well over 80 Champion sailors in National and International Sailing Events.

It is appropriate therefore, at this stage in the Club's history, to quote an

extract from the Captain, Mr T Auchterlonie's, Log in 1924.

"This was a most interesting race and the Sailing Committee hoped that it will stir the enthusiasm of the rising generation of SCYC, as it is to them that we look to build the foundations laid by their fathers, to raise the SCYC to a high place among Yacht Clubs, especially as in our headquarters at Abersoch we have one of the finest sailing spots on the West Coast of England and Wales."

The words of the Captain, Mr Auchterlonie, are as relevant today as they were 100 years ago. Here's to the next 100 years of the South Caernarfonshire Yacht Club and a heartfelt thank you to the Founding Ladies and Gentlemen of SCYC and their families and to the Members and all the Staff over the years for their hard work and commitment that has given the Club a reputation as being a centre of excellence for Sailing Events that it has today.

"This, briefly, is the history of the South Caernarvonshire Yacht Club. Much is missing due to records being lost in a fire, but a vote of thanks should be given to those founder members, who included the writer's mother and her sister, who in 1922 discovered a most perfect spot for a yacht club." Captain Mel Barratt (Commodore 1986-1987)

Most of this record of the History of SCYC is attributed to the work done by Captain Mel Barratt and has been continued by his widow Di in his memory, along with the late Lady Commodore Mrs Anne Munro (Commodore 2017-2018).

Caernarvon and Denbigh Herald **Friday August 10th 1928**

Opening of the Breakwater at Abersoch

Viscount Curzon MP, Captain of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution was given a rousing reception by thousands of visitors and residents at the formal opening of the rebuilt breakwater at Abersoch, Caernarvonshire, on Thursday.

Viscount Curzon, who motored to Abersoch in a small racing car with which he intends competing at the International motor races next month, was conveyed to the breakwater in the Abersoch Lifeboat. Seabird boats belonging to the South Caernarvonshire Yacht Club acted as an escort and the Pwllheli Lifeboat was also present.

The bay was swimming with decorated boats and yachts. The ceremony was favoured with glorious weather and the surrounding hills and the beach, covered with spectators, were a magnificent sight.

The chairman of the Breakwater Repair Fund Committee, Mr Fred Lea, received Lord Curzon on his landing on the breakwater and presented him with a silver model of a lifeboat rudder, with which his lordship, after a short speech, cut the ribbon which had been placed across the breakwater and declared it formally open, amid rousing cheers.

Viscount Curzon said he hoped the new breakwater would be of real service especially to the lifeboat men. He was glad of the opportunity to refer to the heroism and pluck displayed by the crews of Welsh lifeboats, especially during the memorable storm last October, when four Welsh lifeboats were out throughout the night in one of the fiercest gales ever experienced.

The chairman presented the members of the committee to Lord Curzon – namely Messrs H.W. Adshead, J.S. Boumphrey, Llewellyn Hookes, W.A. Hooton, B.C. Stavelly, and Vincent Oliver (hon secretary and treasurer). Before leaving the breakwater Lord Curzon laid a stone on which was inscribed the date of the opening. Later Lord Curzon was entertained at the South Caernarvonshire Yacht Club and in the evening attended a fancy dress ball in aid of the lifeboat at Abersoch.

THE CAPTAIN THOMAS WILLIAMS SEAMANSHIP TROPHY

Awarded annually to the Club member who, in the opinion of the Flag Officers, has shown outstanding seamanship or sportsmanship during the season.

THE CARDIGAN BAY CUP

Awarded annually to any junior member (17 years and under) who, in the opinion of the Flag Officers, has shown outstanding service in the interest of the Club during the season.

RACE OFFICER (RO) RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Starters

The RO is responsible for finding the necessary starters, minimum 2 and 3 in August and on days with more than 3 races per morning or afternoon. It should be possible to man the bridge with only one starter when the light system is used.

2. Inability to Act

Any RO or Starter who is unable to act is personally responsible for finding a substitute. Club staff will only assist on the bridge in the case of an emergency, if willing, and should not be asked to stand-in as RO.

Any RO who races instead of carrying out their duty will automatically cause the boat on which they are racing to be disqualified unless a suitable substitute has been appointed by them, other than Club staff.

3. Time of Attendance

The RO and Starters should be on the lower deck at least ONE HOUR before the start of the first race for which they are responsible. The RO and Starter duty is normally for a morning or afternoon unless otherwise stated.

4. Checking Entry Qualifications

Before declaring the result of any race, the RO's shall satisfy themselves that all entry fees for that race have been paid by the boats starting and that the boat owners are not in arrears with race entry fees for any previous race. This can be checked against the list in the office.

5. Disqualification by the RO

The RO has the power to disqualify a boat from the race being sailed without a hearing in the following circumstances. This is in addition to those specified in the RRS.

5.1 Competitors failing to comply with the Club Rules regarding personal buoyancy as required by Classes 4,6,7 & 10 under SI 5.1.

5.2 Where the owner of any boat entered for a race has not paid the entry fee for that race / series, or is in arrears with race entry fees for any previous race, under SI 4.2.

5.3 Boats failing to sign-on or sign-off, under SI 5.4.

5.4 Boats using radios to gain an advantage or interfere with the running of a race, under SI 21.

6. Patrol Boats

It is the duty of the RO to ensure that at least one Club safety boat is allocated to dinghy racing events.

If the wind strength has reached, or seems likely to reach, Force 4 or more, Club safety boats should be allocated for safety duties on the basis of one patrol boat per 8 starters.

IF CIRCUMSTANCES PREVENT THE RO FROM COMPLYING WITH THIS REQUIREMENT THEN THE RACE OR RACES INVOLVED MUST BE POSTPONED OR CANCELLED.

INFORMATION FOR BOAT OWNERS

1. Moorings

For the common benefit of all owners of boats on moorings, the Club strongly recommend the standardisation of the lengths of up-and-down chains as follows:

- Two anchor moorings - 10 fathoms of chain disregarding strop;
- Ground legs of two anchor moorings to be at least 15 fathoms; and
- Block Moorings - at least 15 fathoms disregarding strop, plus a back-up anchor.

Owners are asked to co-operate by conforming to the above criteria.

2. Care of Boats on Moorings

Please note that neither the Bosun nor any other member of the Club staff, has any responsibility for members' boats on moorings and they must not be asked in any circumstances, to accept such responsibility. They will, of course, do all in their power to protect them in exceptional circumstances, as is considered possible by them at the time.

3. Distress Signals

All boats on moorings must either carry a supply of both types of daylight distress signal (Orange Smoke for "SOS" and White Flares to draw attention where there is no immediate danger) or a VHF Radio. Boats sailing at night must also carry Red Distress Flares for "SOS" use. Please do not use Orange Smoke or Red Flares unless there is danger to life or limb.

4. Radio Watch

A VHF radio station, Call Sign "SCYC", is based at the clubhouse and is normally listening out on Channel M1 (37) during normal office hours. At certain times patrol boats will be in radio contact, again on Channel M1 (37).

HM Coastguard at Holyhead is listening at all times on Channel 16

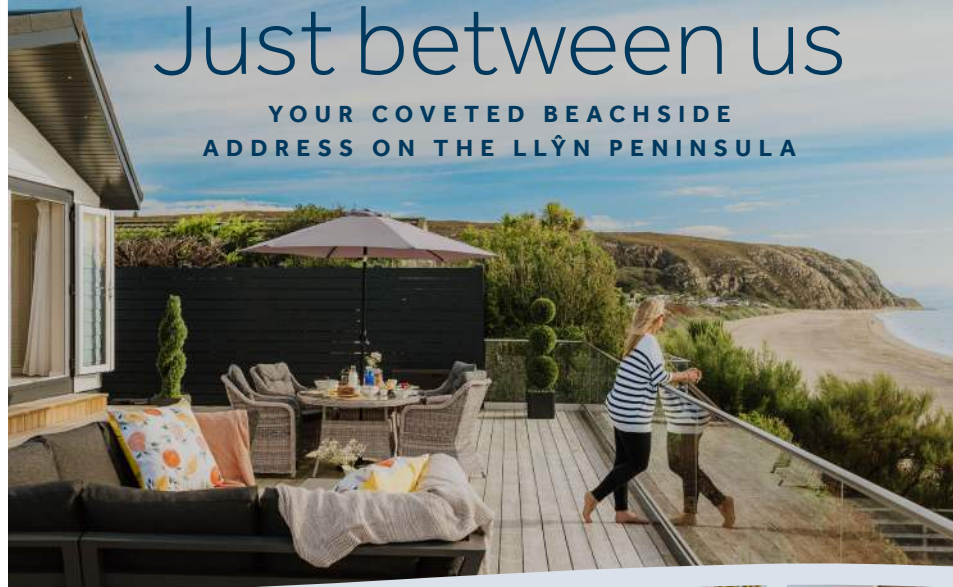

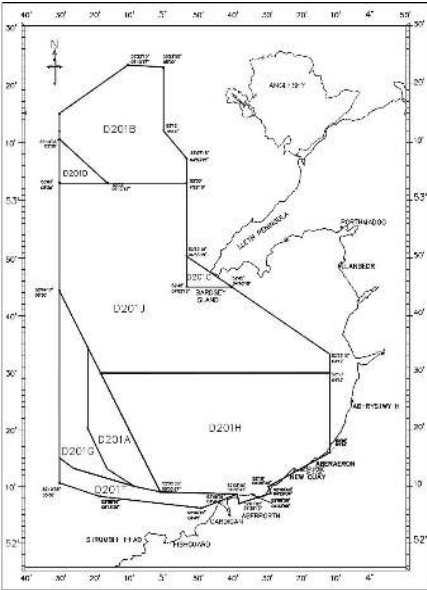
